Leadership, governance and culture	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> There are clear messages about child safety that are available, and easily accessible, to all involved in Community Language Schools. <input type="checkbox"/> School leaders and staff show a commitment to child safety by their actions and behaviour. <input type="checkbox"/> School leaders and staff can give examples of how they manage risks to safety. 	
Empowering children to participate	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Children and young people have a say in how the organisation runs and make suggestions for improvement. <input type="checkbox"/> Staff empower students and talk about their rights. <input type="checkbox"/> The CLS caters for the diverse needs of children. 	
Involving family and community	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> The CLS involves parents, the wider family, and community. <input type="checkbox"/> It is clear how to raise a concern about the CLS. <input type="checkbox"/> The CLS can access advice and support from others about how to meet the diverse needs of children and young people. 	
Child safe and friendly policies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> There is a Code of Conduct for staff and volunteers. <input type="checkbox"/> There are rules for behaviour for all students. <input type="checkbox"/> There are guidelines for physical contact between adults and students, and between the students themselves. 	

Managing staff and volunteers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> It is clear how the CLS recruits and conducts checks on staff and volunteers. <input type="checkbox"/> There is ongoing supervision and support for staff and volunteers. <input type="checkbox"/> Staff feel comfortable to raise concerns about the behaviour of other staff members or volunteers or other areas of improvement. 	
Safe environments – physical and online	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> The physical environment is safe and checked regularly. <input type="checkbox"/> Children can be seen at all times and in all places. <input type="checkbox"/> There are clear rules about communicating with children online or via phones and devices. 	
Complaints processes and reporting	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> The complaints system is clear, child friendly and children are comfortable to use it. <input type="checkbox"/> Children and young people re asked to feedback on their experiences. <input type="checkbox"/> Staff can give examples of when a student made a complaint and how it was handled. 	
Education and development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Staff and volunteers apply their professional learning about their responsibilities to their learning and teaching contexts. <input type="checkbox"/> Staff and volunteers know how to spot the signs of child abuse and how to respond. <input type="checkbox"/> Information is given to students, parents and other community members about child safety. 	
Continuous improvement	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> The CLS regularly reviews the way it does things and shares this information with parents and the community. <input type="checkbox"/> The CLS is audited regularly (internal and external). <input type="checkbox"/> Staff, students, and community members are involved in reviews and audits.
